This is exciting news for patients and families in our region. A new larger, 9000 square foot Emergency Department linked to the hospital will address current space challenges and enhance infection control standards. The new design will also accommodate expanded diagnostic and therapeutic care, as well as a secure operating room. And it will help improve wait times and patient satisfaction.

Now the real works begins. The next step is the detailed planning and design phase. In the coming months, this phase will involve many key stakeholders including patients, neighbours, the community, staff and physicians.
