# Hospital News Sharing is Caring

#### **Updated Visitor Guidelines**



Visiting hours for Almonte General Hospital and Carleton Place and District Memorial Hospital are 10 am to 9 pm daily. By entering the building you are confirming that you pass screening questions posted on the door. Hospital provided masks must be worn at all times and you may be required to wear additional PPE. Keeping patients, staff and the community safe is our number one priority. We will continue to carefully monitor this process and adjust our policy as required by directives received from Public Health and the Ministry of Health.

#### Ministry of Health.
